

Update: Shasta Project

Since the early 1980s, reports of a progressive neurodegenerative disease have been described in Ibizan Hounds. In the 1990s, 4 Ibizan Hounds were diagnosed at Cornell University with a neurodegenerative disease. These Ibizan Hounds had problems starting around 8 months to 2 years of age. The symptoms included ataxia and excessive falling. Pathologic studies of the dogs showed changes in the brain and spinal cord that were consistent with a degenerative disease. In 2010, an Ibizan Hound with a similar symptoms was evaluated by veterinarians at the Texas A&M University College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences. Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) of the affected dog revealed damage consistent with a degenerative disease. Additional analyses performed by pathologists at Texas A&M University, M.D. Anderson Cancer Center, and the Royal Veterinary College confirmed the MRI findings; they further showed

that the dog had degenerative lesions in various regions of the brain (cerebellum, brain stem nuclei) and a relatively normal spinal cord. Two additional dogs in the pedigree were also diagnosed with the same condition. Given the similarity of the clinical signs between the Cornell and Texas A&M cases, it was concluded that this was one disease with a spectrum of pathologic changes.

The cause of the neurodegenerative disease in the Ibizan Hounds was unknown. Of other neurodegenerative diseases described in dogs, few causative mechanisms have been identified. Given the reports of a common disease in the Ibizan Hound breed and the transmission of the disease in the pedigree examined at Texas A&M University, it was believed that the disease was caused by genetic mutation, consistent with many types of neurodegenerative disease in humans. As such, geneticists at the Texas A&M University College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences were asked to identify in the affected Ibizan Hound the genetic mutation causing the disease.

Using next-generation sequencing and array comparative genomic hybridization, the DNA sequences of approximately 20,000 genes were examined in a single affected dog to identify potential disease causing mutations. A linkage analysis was also performed in 2 affected and 10 unaffected dogs to narrow down the location of the disease causing mutation. There were 10 candidate genomic regions and over 300 novel genetic variants (i.e., variants not previously known to exist in dogs) identified in the affected dog. A number of candidate variants located in genes associated with brain function or development were identified, including genes known to cause neurodegenerative disorders in humans (e.g., Ataxia Telangiectasia and Dentatorubral-pallidoluysian atrophy). A large number of these variants were examined in additional dogs and determined not to be disease-causing mutations. Further evaluation of the remaining variants is currently underway.

Meeting adjourned at 9:40pm, next meeting on June 4th at 8:00pm EST via Teleconference.

Rescue Report

Many of you have already heard the sad news of Eric Timat's sudden passing in April. At the time he owned an 8 yr old male Ibizan Hound (named Boogie), a female Saluki and one of their offspring (named Arrow). The Saluki was taken in by STOLA Saluki rescue. Eric's daughter asked IHCUS Rescue to take his remaining two dogs. The IHCUS Board approved taking in Arrow, the Ibizan/Saluki mix, because it was known, beyond a shadow of a doubt, that Arrow was part Ibizan Hound. This is unique in that most dogs that are labeled as Ibizan Hound mixes have unknown origins and are likely a mix of another, more common breed.

I'm pleased to say that both of these dogs have been vetted and adopted. Both dogs had dental cleanings, were tested for parasites and brought up to date on shots. Boogie was neutered (Arrow was already neutered). It's clear that Eric loved his dogs and these boys came into rescue in good condition, with good temperaments and great training, which helped us find

homes for them much faster than typical rescue dogs.

I would like to thank Andy Szydzik and Kristie Stocker for fostering Boogie and Arrow respectively. Thank you to Ky and Linda Boe for helping to transport Arrow to his foster home and thanks to Matt Fox for helping get Arrow to his new adoptive home. Erica Seward did a very thorough home check for us, so I'd like to thank her too. I'm also grateful to Janet Rivers (IHCUS Treasurer) for her assistance in paying and reimbursing vet bills and expenses for both dogs in a quick manner.

Currently, we have no dogs in rescue, however, there are some adults that are currently looking for homes. Please see Erica Kasper's site www.ibizanhoundcentral.com for listings. We would like to help their owners find new homes for them.

Perspectives: Ibizan (Podenco) Rescue in Spain

In some parts of Spain the hunting season is drawing to a close and the real killing can begin. As a podenco, unless you are fortunate enough to belong to a hunter who loves and respects his dogs, there is a good chance that around about now, if you've made it this far, you will be disposed of. You might be injured, sick, old, not such a great hunter or maybe just too expensive to feed until it's time to hunt again. Whatever the reason, if you belong to a hunter who sees you as an insentient hunting device, your number is up. If your master decides you must pay the ultimate price, then either you'll be thrown down a well, have your legs broken and be abandoned in the countryside or maybe have your mouth wedged open or taped shut so you can't eat or drink. Your death, will be agonizing.

Alternatively, your master may take you to the local perrera (municipal dog pound). These places are no stroll in the park and right now they are bursting at the seams. This means one of two things. Either you'll be killed to make room, or a miracle will happen and you'll be spotted by a rescue organisation and be taken out. This is exactly what happened to Amira, a beautiful Podenco Ibizenco (Ibizan Hound). Bev Farmer, founder of Podenco Friends in Murcia, Spain, introduces her story:

"Last February, I went to a perrera to collect two podencos. As I walked down the long corridor, I saw a beautiful podenca, tail between her legs, cowering in the corner of her kennel. The fear in her eyes was haunting. I went to her, and although terrified, she fell into my arms. I asked if I could take her but she was reserved for another association.

In March, the perrera staff informed me that Amira had escaped from that association and was living in the countryside. We agreed that if they could catch her, I would take her. Two weeks later, I got the call. When I arrived, Amira refused to walk. She was bolted to the floor, paralysed with fear. I carried her to the car and

managed to get her into the travel crate. When we arrived home and opened the crate door, she was so rigid with fear that we were forced to carefully dismantle it around her.

For days she was in a state of shock and would stand in one place for hours, terrified to move. Everything scared her. She would only eat from the ground and even our own dogs sensed that she needed space. When I walked towards her she fell to the ground. Her gait was so stiff that I asked our vet to examine her. His verdict - pure fear caused her to walk this way. I have never seen a dog so shut down, she reminded me of a battered wife, waiting for permission to breathe.

After a while she began to unbend a little. On walks she and held her tail high and her true beauty shone through. When I felt confident enough to release her from her leash, she ran free on the beach. It brought tears to my eyes.



In May we moved to a new place in the countryside and Amira continued to blossom. She loved her runs and soon discovered the bed, and then toys. When she was alone with me she was playful and would give me her special kisses on my eyes and ask to be stroked. Although she remained wary of the unfamiliar, to watch her become a free spirit once more was a joy to behold.

Our role is that of temporary guardians. We rescue and rehabilitate but our ultimate goal for each dog, is a new home. It was time for Amira to find her human soulmate to and continue her journey.

It is only in the last few months that we have had interested adopters from America, but as within every country of adoption, a back up system is vital in case anything should go wrong. We currently have a small network of people we can call on for assistance and our aim is to expand slowly in order to minimise the vulnerability of both our dogs and our adopters.

Our adoption process is straightforward but comprehensive. Interested parties fill out a questionnaire to help assess their suitability, and further discussion helps us match the right dog to the right family. At this point we arrange a home check. Once that is satisfactorily completed, we finalise the adoption contract and make arrangements for travel. Sending a dog to America is rather costly and we must try to maximize the number of dogs per flight to make it more cost effective.

All our podencos have passports; they are microchipped, fully vaccinated and tested for Leishmania, Filaria, Ehrlichia and Babesia (with a certified lab report). If they are old enough, they are also neutered before they leave us."

It was time to prepare Amira for adoption. Her story is now taken up by Nan Kilgore Little, a long term member of the Ibizan Hound Club of The United States:

"Forty years in Ibizan Hounds and I was only recently able to see the beautiful dogs of Spain. I came late to the internet, living as I do in the backwoods. I was amazed at the beauty and skill of my breed in its native land, but then I discovered the dark side, the horrendous aggressive cruelty by some, in mother Spain. These dogs we have so treasured are not only often cruelly neglected, but tortured! I know many fine hunters in

Spain who cherish and love their hounds. What I was seeing was the stuff of nightmares.

What to do? I started raising awareness among my fellow Ibizan lovers in America, donating works to raise funds. Little did I know my best patron and good friend would offer to bring me an orphan home from Spain. How could I refuse? Here was a chance for a poster child. With the help of many fine people, among them Martha



Feltenstein and Beverley Farmer, Amira made the flight to America in November last year.

Amira is a doll, a funny girl who loves toys. Sweet, loving and more appreciative of me than my spoiled homebred Ibizans, she was accepted into the pack like family. She has much to recover from and still occasionally barks at my son and husband. These orphans from Spain are so beautiful, I cannot praise them enough. If you can't adopt, please consider helping in any way you can. Funds and helping to raise awareness of their horrible plight are both so necessary."

Bev recalls how she discovered the connection between the Podenco Ibicenco and the Ibizan Hound and explains her rescue and rehabilitation philosophy:

"Back in 2003 when we adopted Tilly, we didn't even know what a podenco was. In 2008 when our doberman, Oscar, died, Tilly's grief was so profound that we knew we had to find her another mate. An internet search yielded the Ibizan Hound. I admired its beauty but believed it to be a generic breed from America and unrelated to the podenco. It was only in 2012, after a chance post by a friend led me to Nan Kilgore-Little, that I discovered that they were introduced into America in 1956 by Colonel and Mrs. Consuelo Seone and that Nan had been a breeder of the Ibizan Hound for many years. When I received a message that Nan wanted to adopt a Amira, I realised we had come full circle.

Like Amira, the majority of the podencos we rescue have had a very harsh life indeed. Many walk through our gates shellshocked, emaciated and exhausted. There is no life in their eyes and the slightest movement can spook them. These rescues do not live in kennels. They become a part of our extended family and their rehabilitation is precipitated by our own eight podencos who show them that here there is nothing to fear. They have room to run free, and as much time as they need to allow some of the physical and mental scars to fade before they are offered for adoption.

The rescue, rehabilitation and re-homing of podencos is vital, but equally important is that we reveal to the world outside of Spain, what is happening to thousands of these beautiful dogs every year. Not only does this benefit the work we do, it helps other groups and associations in Spain who are also active in helping the podencos. We must all work together to open more doors for this beautiful noble breed and continue to develop responsible rehabilitation and re-homing programs. Only then can many more podencos be saved."

All Dog Show Guidelines Apply

Time of Arrival: after 4pm / Departure Time: by 11am

Dogs left unattended in a guest room must be in a crate. Plastic sheeting should be placed under each crate in the guest room area

Hotel guest with dogs in the room need to use the special door hanger provided by the hotel. This hanger will leave instructions to the housekeeping staff. Housekeeping will not enter the room unless the door hanger is present

Housekeeping must be allowed to clean a guest room (with dogs) at least every two days. Guests who have special requests (i.e. a certain time of the day that the room will be vacant) can discuss them with the housekeeping staff upon arrival

Owners/exhibitors should bring their own towel for bathing the dogs. A daily inventory for missing or damaged towels will be taken. Any necessary charges will be applied to the guest

Bathing and/or grooming of dogs in or right outside the guest room is not allowed. The hotel will impose a \$100 penalty to anyone found grooming in this manner. The hotel has a grooming house on the grounds, which will be available for use. Grooming is not allowed on any sidewalks

The individual guest will be responsible for any damage to a guest room or any hotel property. This includes, but not limited to, replacement cost for carpeting if odors or stains cannot be removed with traditional cleaning methods

Dogs are to be leashed at all times when out of the guest room



AKC National Owner-Handled Series



The AKC National Owner-Handled Series is a non-titling competition for dogs that are exhibited by their owners that are not professional handlers.

All dogs that are owner-handled and are not owned, co-owned or exhibited by professional handlers* meet the requirements for this competition. Exhibitors must declare their dog is Owner-Handled eligible at the time of entry using the check box on the entry form. Eligible dogs will be identified by an asterisk in the steward's book & the catalog.

Dogs must be handled throughout the breed level competition for the regular show by an eligible owner.

Professional handlers, household members and current assistants to professional handlers may not exhibit the dog in this competition.**

- Owner-Handled Best of Breed/Variety will be selected from the dogs that are eligible to compete in the Best of Breed/Variety competition including Winners Dog, Winners Bitch and winners of the non-regular classes.
- If the Best of Breed/Variety winner is Owner-Handled competition eligible, it will automatically be Owner-Handled Best of Breed/Variety and be eligible to compete in both the regular as well as the Owner-Handled group.
- If the Best of Breed/Variety winner is not eligible for Owner-Handled competition and the Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed/Variety is eligible, the Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed/Variety will compete against the eligible exhibits of the other sex to determine Owner/Handled Best of Breed/Variety.
- If neither the Best of Breed/Variety nor the Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed/Variety are Owner-Handled competition eligible and Select Dog & Select Bitch are both eligible, the judge is to choose Best Owner-Handled exhibit from the Selects and eligible Winners Dog or Winners Bitch.
- If one of the Selects is eligible, excuse all Champions and non-regular class winners of the same sex and then choose Best Owner-Handled exhibit from the remaining dogs of the opposite sex including the eligible Winners.
- If the regular show Best of Breed/Variety, Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed/Variety, Select Dog & Select Bitch are not eligible, the judge may choose any eligible dog who competed in Best of Breed/Variety including Winners Dog or Winners Bitch as the Best of Breed/Variety for the AKC National Owner-Handled Series.
- If the Best of Winners is eligible, the other Winners are ineligible since it was defeated.
- No class dogs other than the Winners Dog & Winners Bitch are eligible to return to the ring.

*Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay or received payment for handling a dog.

**A current assistant is defined as anyone employed by a professional handler on a full-time basis, or, assisting a professional handler at the show or any show during the cluster/weekend.










Digestive Aids for Dogs

I often get requests from people wanting digestive aids for their dogs. By the questions I receive, it seems either folks do not understand the differences between enzymes and probiotics, or they get the two confused. This newsletter explains the differences and benefits of both so you can make the right choices for your dogs.

Enzymes and Probiotics are two different supplements that both support digestion, but each of them works differently to support the digestive system.

Enzymes

Enzymes help break down proteins, fats and carbohydrates into smaller units so they can be more easily absorbed in the small intestine. There are certain health conditions and diseases hinder the body's ability to do this on its own, so adding enzymes to the diet helps assimilate the nutrients and aids in better digestion.

In humans, carbohydrate digestion starts in the mouth because humans have amylase in their saliva. However, dogs are carnivores and they do not produce amylase in their saliva, so the digestion of carbohydrates begins in their stomachs, as well as some protein digestion. Hydrochloric Acid is released in the stomach, which in turn, stimulates the production of pepsin. This starts protein digestion. Hydrochloric Acid (HCl) has a pH of one, which helps kill microorganisms.

Fats are only broken down (into lipids) in the small intestine. Bile releases and emulsifies the fats. The enzymes released from the pancreas contain pancreatin, which breaks down the fats in lipids. The enzymes released from the pancreas also include amylase, which reduces the carbohydrates to sugars or glucose. Protease helps break down proteins into amino acids. Lastly, the pancreas secretes bicarbonate to raise the pH 1 from the HCl in the stomach to a more neutral pH number.

When looking for a digestion aid, it is important to find an enzyme product that covers all stages of digestion. For dogs, this includes Ox Bile extract, which helps stimulate HCl production, and pepsin, which aids protein digestion for the stomach. For the small intestine, pancreatin and pancreatic lipase are important for fat digestion. Amylase is important for carbohydrate digestion. Trypsin is important for protein digestion.

Papain (made from papayas) and Bromelain (made from pineapples) are plant enzymes. These two enzymes are helpful for digestion as they help control gas and indigestion. Bromelain not only assists with proper digestion, it also helps inflammation, if not given with food. Both Papain and Bromelain enzymes enhance the enzymes already in produced in the body by the pancreas.

Some health issues can be helped by adding additional enzymes to the diet.

If your dog suffers from allergies, adding in enzymes to their diet can help break down the proteins that may be causing the allergic reactions.

Liver issues can be helped as well! Adding in enzymes to the diet can help with the digestion of fats. This helps relieve some of the stress that is on the liver.

Irritable Bowel Disease (IBD) is another common health issue with dogs and adding extra enzymes to the diet can help digest fats, proteins and starches for better digestion and absorption of nutrients.

Dogs suffering from autoimmune diseases and cancer can also benefit from extra enzymes because their bodies and organs are compromised. Adding additional enzymes to your dog's diet can assist with the breakdown of proteins, fats and carbohydrates so the nutrients can be more easily absorbed.

If you are looking to change your dog's diet, from a commercial food to a raw or cooked diet, adding extra enzymes to the meals helps ease the transition from one diet to another.

Lastly, if your dog suffers from inflammation issues, many enzymes help lower inflammation response.

Depending on the health condition of the dog, I recommend two supplements. For dogs needing an extra enzyme boost, there is Berte's Zymes, which is a blend of digestive enzymes from both plant and animal based enzymes. For dogs with more serious digestive health issues, there is Berte's Digestion Blend. This product contains pancreatic enzymes and amino acids, medicinal herbs and beneficial bacteria (probiotics). It also contains 500 mg of the amino acid L-Glutamine helps heal the intestinal lining due to inflammation, assists in metabolizing proteins and sugars and supports immune system function. This product was developed to help dogs with irritable bowel syndrome, colitis and ulcers.

Probiotics

The term Probiotics refers to the beneficial bacteria in the digestive tract. These bacteria help to keep the 'bad' or unfriendly bacteria in check. Common beneficial bacteria include lactobacilli and bifidobacteria, which are often called acidophilus and bifidus. These bacteria are thought to produce antimicrobial metabolites, which help support the immune system and aid in mucosal conditioning. When certain factors reduce the friendly bacteria, an overgrowth of pathogenic bacteria can result which can cause digestive upsets and yeast infections. Some things that can cause a reduction in the friendly bacteria include antibiotics, stress, illness, and diarrhea.

Using probiotics helps help keep the friendly bacteria in the digestive tract balanced and it can replenish the friendly bacteria lost through antibiotic use, illness and diarrhea. It helps maintain a healthier digestive tract and helps keep stools firmer. Probiotics are often a recommended supplement if your dog has Irritable Bowel Disease (IBD) or Irritable Bowel Syndrome as these conditions can be associated with bacteria overgrowths in the digestive tract. It is very beneficial to add probiotics to your dogs' diet after any antibiotic treatment or during stressful times such as changing diets, boarding, traveling, training, or after surgery. Berte's Ultra Probiotics contains a mix of beneficial bacteria and is an excellent supplement to support the digestive system.

Immediacare GI is another recommended product that helps firm up loose stools, supports rapid gastrointestinal balance associated with microflora imbalances, garbage gut, food sensitivities, stress, age, and traveling. It is also great for whelping moms, puppies and dogs that will take a paste form better during illness than a powder. This is a great supplement to consider for your first aid kit if you are traveling with your pet this summer.

It is very safe to use both Probiotics and Enzymes together if needed. While both support digestive function, they each address different digestive issues. I hope that this information clarifies any confusion you might have had about the purpose for and benefit of these two supplements and how they support the digestive system.



Since 2002, thousands of fellow dog breeders and enthusiasts have declared their participation in the Purina Parent Club Partnership (PPCP) Program. This program allows national parent breed clubs to individually earn funding based on Purina weight circle submissions by Pro Club® members.

How it Works

Pro Club members submit weight circles from bags of participating Purina® Brand Dog Foods and accumulate weight circle points as part of the Pro Club Weight Circle Program. (Refer to Purina Pro Club Weight Circle Program for the program details). Purina tracks these weight circle submissions, and for every \$100 of qualifying weight circle points earned by Pro Club members, Purina donates \$10 to the participating national parent breed club. It is as simple as that.

Points are accumulated throughout a calendar year, and a check representing 10 percent of the value of the submitted weight circles for the year is evenly split between the participating national parent breed club and the AKC Canine Health Foundation. Since all funding is incremental to the weight circle program, your participation in the PPCP will not result in a reduction of the points you personally earn.

Funding Distribution

One half of each club's individual annual earnings is issued directly to the Canine Health Foundation to support research grants aimed at a better understanding of genetics and other conditions impacting our dogs' health. The other half is issued to the individual national parent breed club for use in the support of canine health research, education and/or rescue efforts (IHCUS received \$306,76 this year). The PPCP Program has raised in excess of \$3.5 million for canine health research, education and rescue efforts since 2002.

In addition to helping fund canine health research projects, the funding returned to the individual clubs has been used to help support educational outreach programs such as scholarships, library support, youth programs and conservation education programs. It has also been used to support judges' education seminars, to produce breed specific educational materials and to produce responsible dog ownership materials.

Rescue programs have benefited with funds being used for the direct care of dogs in need, the development of fund raising tools and the support of adoption events.

How to Participate in the PPCP Program

You must be a Purina® Pro Club® Member to participate. Pro Club® members must individually declare their participation in the program and identify the national parent breed club that will receive their Purina Points. **Members may declare for their national parent breed club by calling the Purina® Pro Club® toll-free number at 1-877-PRO-CLUB (1-877-776-2582) from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. CST, Monday through Friday, or by registering on this site: (https://pointcenter.purinaproclub.com/PurinaNet_CW/Pages/PointCenter/MyAccount/SignUpPage1.aspx)** Pro Club members can only earn funds for their national parent breed club if the national parent breed club is enrolled in the PPCP Program (*IHCUS is enrolled*).


