The mission of the IHCUS Health and Rescue Committee Information Program is to help Ibizan Hounds live a longer and healthier life through periodically monitoring the health status of the breed, developing resources to improve breed health with an emphasis on understanding canine genetics and to help apply health information to improve breeding programs and owner care guidance.

Goals

To identify health issues of concern to dog owners and breeders

To seek ways to use the observations, experience and knowledge of Ibizan Hound owners, breeders, veterinarians, and other canine experts to advance the health of the Ibizan Hound

- To identify and sponsor research and education programs that ...
 - 1. Meet the highest scientific and educational standards
 - 2. Have the greatest potential for advancing the health of the Ibizan Hound
 - 3. Have expectations for producing materials and applications that are reasonable and affordable for breeders and owners
- To responsibly monitor any grant work done for the Ibizan Hound breed and make the results of such work available for dissemination to IHCUS members, the Ibizan Hound breeders and owners, and to the public through publication in the IHCUS Third Eye, professional journals, and the AKC Canine Health Foundation
- To facilitate IHCUS cooperation with the projects and programs of the AKC Canine Health Foundation
- To help raise funds adequate to advance IHCUS Health specific projects
- To keep up to date regarding the American Kennel Club's guidelines for responsible owners and breeders (<u>akc-guidelines-for-dog-owners</u>)
- To Promote the findings of the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA), <u>www.ofa.org</u>, in regards to the Ibizan Hound. This will include the following:
 - o Cardiac Disease
 - Congential Deafness (OFA Evaluation based on BAER Test
 - Eye Diseasse (Results registered with OFA or CERF)
 - Hip Dysplasia (OFA Evaluation or PennHip Evaluation)
 - Thyroid (OFA evaluation from an approved laboratory)

Recommendations:

To create a health and promote a survey for Ibizan Hounds with OFA (www.ofa.org/surveys/index.html)

The goal of this survey is to identify and prioritize health issues of AKC registered Ibizan Hounds. The survey results will be tabulated to provide statistical information to better support breeder and canine research experts with current breed trends that affect health concerns in the breed. This important information will be shared via the OFA site free of charge to all interested parties. All results are entirely confidential. Results will only be reported in aggregate.

Breed Club Health Surveys

The OFA offers breed surveys for a number of breed parent clubs. These surveys are offered free of charge. All data is used only in aggregate and is kept confidential. No survey results will be traceable to any individual dog. It is hoped that this information will be valuable to breed clubs as they assess the health issues of their breed. Health Issues in the Ibizan Hounds

Every breed of dog, like humans, has genetically based health advantages as well as inherent health risks or problems. Ibizan Hounds have some common health issues that can be found as well in many other dog breeds but there are a few health concerns that are more predominate in the Ibizan Hound breed. Health tests currently allow us to screen breeding stock for some of these problems, and with today's exciting scientific based DNA testing technology we can benefit from research that identifies abnormal genes via testing that thereby will aid in the eradication of genetic inheritable disease. Below are some health issues of concern to Ibizan Hound breed, breeders and owners.
