



Might I point out that the changes to the Constitution and Bylaws regarding conducting Board business via e-mail, once approved by the Board, will have to go to AKC before going to the membership for a final vote. AKC has specific guidelines concerning this matter and must approve any recommended changes before the matter can go to the membership for a vote. It gets complicated, but it is all do-able.

I must emphasize that this also pertains to the Bylaw changes that were approved by the membership in May of this year regarding the selection of sweepstakes judges by the membership. We have not as yet received approval from AKC on that change and, until we do, we will not be able to implement it. We requested nominations for sweepstakes judges in order that, after AKC has given its approval, we will be ready with a list in place.

This past July, I received a letter from the AKC Director of Club Relations listing allegations from an unnamed individual towards the previous President and Board members. The Board submitted their comments to me, which I carefully considered, and then I responded to the letter in good faith as your President. I will keep you updated once I receive a response from AKC.

Also included is the Treasurer's Audit Report that is way overdue, for which I apologize. The new Breeder Referral Application is also included.

With the holidays soon approaching, I would like to take this opportunity to wish all of you a very happy Thanksgiving as well as a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Changes to the Constitution and Bylaws regarding conducting board business via e-mail, the ability of treasurer to pay normal club operating expenses up to \$250.00 without Board approval, and specified turnaround time for e-mail balloting have been approved by the board.

A sample ballot was sent to the Constitution Committee Chair for legal review and recommendations prior to distribution to the membership.

After the Constitution Committee Chair approves the wording of the ballot, it will be presented to the board for approval and then mailed to the membership for their vote. The board recommends approval of all three items, as they will not only facilitate conducting the club's business in a timely and efficient manner, but will also bring our Constitution and Bylaws more in line with modern technology and the AKC's position regarding it.

The Board has approved a revised Specialty Application, which now includes a more detailed budget section. The Specialty Application is available from the Secretary and can be sent via e-mail as an attachment (it is a Microsoft Word document), or through regular U.S. postal service.

The board approved a request for a supported entry submitted by Melissa Steward.

Stephanie Bonner was approved by the board as the IHCUS delegate for ASFA. Our membership in ASFA has been renewed for another year.

Leslie Lucas has been approved as a new Breed Expert.


There was one IHCUS supported entry show between August, 2000, and September, 2001. (Central New Jersey Hound Association, September 6, 2001, submitted and coordinated by Ed Kimble.)

The Board has unanimously approved Louisville, Kentucky, as the site of the 2002 National Specialty, which will be held on Wednesday, March 13, 2002, in conjunction with the Combined Specialty Clubs of Louisville. The Conformation judge will be Jon Cole; the Sweeps judge will be Charles C. Scott of New Castle, Indiana.

Nomination pages for conformation and sweeps judges for the 2003 and 2004 national specialties have been mailed to the membership. Please note that there are two pages – one for conformation judges and one for sweeps judges.

Third Eye yearly report

Third Eye has had a successful year. Revenue for ads is growing with each issue. Revenue for ads was approximately \$900 for the year. Most ads are full page ads for individual dogs. Growth in the area could be improved with ads with Ibizan Hound related materials/goods.

Cost of production for Third Eye has gained control. Two issues (Specialty/Fall 2000 and January/Winter 2001) were produced on laser paper. We went to a less costly 70# paper for the April/Spring 2001 issue with positive results. Printing goes directly from computer to laser printer allowing maximum printing quality (especially for photos) Kinkos has been the production printer offering IHCUS a 10% as a non-profit. I've decided to minimize cost with having 30 page issues. Average costs for printing approximately 110 issues has been from \$225-\$275. I staple all the issues myself saving \$10.

Other costs for Third Eye include supplies (envelopes, labels) and mailing costs. Mailing costs have been on average \$150-\$175 depending on weight of issue (number of pages) and that would include shipping to all members, subscribers, and extra copies mailed to Membership Chair (5-8 issues)

Currently we have 4 subscribers (they do not belong to IHCUS) and they are charged \$20 a year for subscription, covering the costs of printing and mailing.

Items that seem to be working for issues are: artwork for covers (either I solicit or someone volunteers), more candid photos (people want to see the dogs!) and more articles. I would like to see more health related articles sent to Third Eye for publication because people want to have that information. I would also like people to submit show reports (as well as for lure coursing, agility, obedience) for bigger entries with articles about the people and their dogs. And above all----PHOTOS!



I staple every issue, put in inserts, put on mailing labels, lick stamps, and all this does not include the number of hours I put into layout and organization. It would be appreciated to get some feedback occasionally so that I might improve or change anything. I hear very little if any feedback. 

Breeder Referral Committee Report September 2001

As many of you know, Elizabeth Binney has been the Breeder Referral Committee Chairperson for the past four years. Elizabeth was the first BR Chair and was instrumental in forming the committee as it is known today. She deserves one big "Thank You" for all of her hard work. Elizabeth will remain on the committee as past chairperson.

Gail Burgess joined the committee in the fall of 1999 and has also worked extremely hard on the BR Committee and I am happy to say she will be remaining on the committee. Her contributions to the BR Committee have been absolutely brilliant.


I would like to thank Elizabeth for having the confidence in me to recommend me to the board and the board's accepting that recommendation as the new Chairperson for the Breeder Referral Committee and hope I will fill the shoes as well as Elizabeth has for the past four years. I also joined the BR Committee in the fall of 1999 and took over as the contact person January 2000. I have owned dogs all my life and currently have 2 Ibizans---Ch. Luxor's Public Enemy, FCH, "Pony Dog" and Luxor's Wings of Speed, "Jato." My background includes 30 plus years experience in animal welfare. I have worked at no kill shelters and served on the board of Denver's oldest animal welfare agency. During this period I was also licensed by the Federal government and the State of Colorado as a wild bird rehabilitator for 10 years.

I would like to thank the 16 individuals who submitted their applications and participated in the Breeder Referral Program this past year and shared information about this beautiful breed to prospective new owners. Application forms will be included with the annual dues application for those interested in participating this coming year. Participants need to reapply annually. Changes to the Application Form were necessary so if you have any questions please feel free to contact me before submitting your application to insure that you make the deadline to be on this coming year's list.

One of the goals of the BR Committee is to continue to improve our breeder referral service. I am happy to say the proposals sent to the board in July 2000 have been approved. The new brochure will be included in the packets of information sent to prospective Ibizan buyers as soon as John O'Malley recovers from the Specialty and puts the final touches on it. In addition to the new brochure, protocols for the Breeder Referral Committee and Breeder Referral Contact person and their duties was approved. This will insure consistency of the committee as the chairperson and committee members change in future years. An updated version of "Selecting a Breeder" handout and the updated "Breeder Referral List Application Form" have been approved and have been submitted for printing in the Third Eye. The proposal we made to the board with Rescue Committee concerning members on the Breeder Referral List and members in general whose dogs they breed that end up in IHCUS Rescue or other rescue organizations was also approved.

A summary of the 2001 breeder referral form from Jan. 1 to Aug. 31 is: 132 requests for breed information/breeder list packets; the source of requests, 20 IHCUS web, 23 AKC web, 24 other web sites, 12 Dog Fancy, 6 Dog World, 1 member referral and 46 unknown sources (these are people who could not remember how they found IHCUS Breeder Referral Contact Person), requests came in the form of 101 e-mail, 23 phone, and 8 letters. We had 88 inquiries between Jan. 1 and Aug. 31, 2000.





Sweeps Judge- Kay Durr

First let me thank you for allowing me the honor to judge your sweepstakes entry at the 2001 National Speciality. Although the entry was small, I enjoyed it greatly.


In puppy sweeps there was one puppy dog and one junior puppy bitch. Both were extremely lovely with great temperaments. I chose the puppy dog for Best in Puppy Sweeps and the bitch was Best Opposite. My reason for preferring the dog over the bitch on this day, was the substance of the dog. It was not an easy decision, because on this day, the puppy dog was extremely loose in the front, but I feel this will improve as he ages.

In veteran sweeps, I had 2 nice male veterans, both very different from each other. The veteran I placed 2nd, I just fell in love with when he entered the ring. Such presence and attitude about him. But I found him to be a bit short in back and thus on this day he was sidewinding, which was also causing him to



elbow out a bit to avoid those back feet. My 1st place dog was more balanced and bigger overall, and although his movement was a bit wide in the rear, it was better overall.

The veteran bitch entry was extremely feminine. She exuded bitchy. Very typey and good movement. Beautiful color and expression. I would have preferred more knuckled feet and more slope to the pasterns. I placed her as Best in Veterans Sweeps because of her better movement.



I have been following the breed for many years and always enjoyed them. Overall, after watching the speciality, there are a couple of comments I would like to make about what "I" observed about the breed. It appears to me, that in the breeders quest for that 'straight' front, the fronts are being set on the body too far forward, and thus the breed is totally losing the forechest.

The Ibizan Hound standard states: "the breastbone sharply angled and prominent". I found it difficult to see the breastbone on many of the exhibits. Also with these fronts being set on the body too far forward, it is causing a right angle of the neck to the topline. Your standard states: "The topline from ears to tail is smooth and flowing" and this is also being lost. This is also what is giving a lot of the dogs/bitches, those ewe necks. Rear angulation, your standard calls for Moderate - meaning not TOO much, nor TOO little. The length of second thigh should be equal to the length of the first thigh. My recommendation, study and learn the standard and make every attempt to breed to it, not trying to improve on it.

On the good side, I thought shoulder laybacks were very nice overall with the proper more upright upper arm. Temperaments were fantastic and movement overall, very acceptable.





Judge- Susan St. John Brown

The wire entries in the Best of Breed competition were also outstanding in quality. How exciting to see this side of the breed making such great strides. I hope the breeders will be vigilant in demanding good complete coats as they advance their wire breeding programs.

Congratulations! To all of the breeders, owners and exhibitors on

a great National. Thank you all for trusting me to judge your lovely hounds.


This is probably the hardest column I have ever written. Please forgive me if it's not up to my usual standards and is very personal. As many of you know, Corey died very recently. He simply dropped dead in the yard.

He was my first Beezer and the foundation for whatever future I have in the breed. Mary Anne Stevens graciously let me have him when I was looking for a finished Champion to play with in the conformation ring. I was into obedience in a big way (had been for 20 years) but wanted to have something competitive for the breed ring and more of a challenge in the obedience ring. We will never know what happened when he was shipped, but he arrived in a serious state of shipping shock and never completely recovered. He shook so hard in the ring that his teeth chattered (his specials career was extremely short!) and his opinion of obedience does not bear repeating in mixed company. I have recovered from my addiction (thank you for asking) and don't even miss it much anymore.

After a year of sharing my life with him, I knew there was no other breed for me. He was meant to be a one and only but became a beginning. I now have 4 1/2 and plans for at least the next 3 generations and am a firm believer in the potato chip syndrome- Just one IB is never enough!

As you know, it is so hard to let them go. I roll over at night, and there's no boney butt hogging the bed, snoring and busily dreaming. It's so quiet- the girls have been very subdued and there's no one conversing until all hours with the neighborhood dogs and coyotes. My stays made- the pillows are not on the floor and the covers rearranged from him sleeping all day. We sleep in, because his stomach alarm clock no longer goes off at 5:30 AM. Dinner is sometimes late for the same reason. I can get dressed without a cold nose helping. No one plays practical jokes on us anymore (and then look SO innocent!) Life has become rather boring. A temporary situation, I am sure. Someone is sure to become house clown before long.

My life has never been the same since he came to live with me. It will never be the same now that he is gone.



Flyin' Beezers!

Finally, it has happened. The first and only Ibizan Hound is in flyball. Fire Rock's Southern Belle (aka Scarlett) is the breed guinea pig in this fast and exciting sport.

What is flyball? Flyball is a fast paced relay race where two teams of 4 dogs each compete to see who can complete the course in the least amount of time without any mistakes. The course is 51 feet long and consists of 4 jumps that are 10 feet apart with a mechanical box at the end that when triggered by the dog releases a tennis ball which they catch and bring back over the jumps. The handler is required to stay behind the start/finish line and can not cross it without causing a penalty. Other penalties include the dog missing a jump, not carrying the ball back across the start/finish line, and interfering with the opposing team. When a penalty is incurred, the dog must rerun the course in order for the team to "finish" the race.



Points are accumulated by your team running under a certain time. Each dog that runs can earn 25 points if all 4 dogs on the team complete the course under 24 seconds. 5 points are earned for running under 28 seconds and 1 point for running under 32 seconds. Thus, the faster and more consistent your team is the more points your dog can earn. Titles are earned at 25, 100, 500, 5,000, 10,000, 15,000 and 20,000 points. Don't think this is unattainable - the dog with the highest point total has over 70,000 points!

As for training an Ibizan Hound for flyball, there is lots of on-leash work involved. Scarlett started serious training back in May, and we are still on leash for most of the practice session. Teaching your dog to go over the jumps is not a big task, it is training them to go over 4 in a row by them-

selves. I have been teaching the box part of the course separate from the jumps. We are working on recalls over the jumps right now. Someone holds the dog at one end of the course and I run to the other yelling "Over!" and holding out a favorite toy or special treat. I have found that the treat works the best. Scarlett will be going so fast that she runs right by me, but as long as I hold that treat out, she puts on the brakes and comes back to get it. (I use the liver loaf available at dog shows in case anyone was wondering. This treat is only used for flyball in order to make it special.) As for box training, you want the dog to know "Push!" or "Shake!" This gives them a command to lift their foot and press on the box. They usually catch on pretty quick that the ball comes out of the box and they can catch it. I have had problems with Scarlett not wanting to push on the box because it had dirt on it. Sometimes, the tennis ball just isn't the right one and she will drop it or just not catch it and watch it roll away. She is also preoccupied with the dog in the other lane. Baby gates, x-pens, or even garden fencing in between lanes is a good tool to use to prevent dogs from crossing over.


I urge everyone to look into flyball as a fun, interactive sport that you can enjoy with your dog. In the case of Ibizan Hounds, it may take a while to train (I've seen some dogs (other breeds) that take a year or longer and some that catch on in 3 weeks) but once you can see your dog running and jumping and having a blast, that is a reward in itself. Besides, we all know that running and jumping are two of the Ibizan Hound's favorite things to do. AKC Library/Ibizan Standard

Recently I was talking to a friend about what might be an interesting piece to put in *Third Eye*. She suggested that I might consider printing an older copy of the original Ibizan Hound standard along side the current one. I wondered where I might find that information as that I am fairly new to the breed. She then suggested the AKC Library.

Wow! What a find! On AKC's web site there is a link to the AKC Library. I quickly emailed the Library inquiring about past copies of the standard. Within a day they sent me copies of the standard along with a couple of other interesting pieces. I was also sent a flyer about the AKC Library. The Library has approximately 17,000 volumes including periodicals. It is one of the world's largest libraries devoted to dogs and the sport and enjoyment of dogs.

The AKC Library carries all kinds of periodicals, newspapers, videocassettes, and has an online catalog. I think it is a great resource for anyone seeking information about the development of purebred dogs, grooming, tips on selecting breeds, as well as dog related activities. One can request information at library@akc.org. The librarian with whom I communicated with indicated to me that the Library is lacking in information about the Ibizan Hound. They have asked me to send them copies of the *Third Eye*, but I would also like to suggest that we as Ibizan Hound fanciers make a concerted effort to get materials to the AKC Library so that more people have access to information about the breed.

Here are some highlights.....

AKC Ibizan Hound Standard- Effective January 1, 1979

Eyes- Oblique and small, ranging in color from clear amber to caramel; aspect intelligent and unpredictable

Ears- Prominent prick ears, always rigid; erect on alert, but highly mobile and at times pointed forward, sideways, or backward, according to mood. The center of the base is at the level of the eyes, and in the form of an enlarged rhomboid truncated at a third of its longer diagonal. Thin, with texture of fine leather; no hair in interior

Nose- Prominent, extending beyond lower jaw; flesh color tending to harmonize with that of coat; nostrils open.

Chest- Deep and long; breastbone sharply angled and very prominent; flat ribs, protruding when dog is in top working condition.

Gait- A trot in suspension; elegant and graceful in the manner of the Afghan.

AKC Ibizan Hound Standard-Effective November 1, 1989


Eyes- The eyes are oblique and small, ranging in color from clear amber to caramel. The rims are the color of the nose and are fully or partially pigmented. The appearance of the eye is intelligent, alert and inquisitive

Ears- The ears are large, pointed and natural. On alert the ear should never droop, bend, or crease. Highly mobile, the ear can point forward, sideways, or be folded backward, according to mood. On alert, the lowest point of the base is at level of the eye. On frontal examination, the height of the ear is approximately 2 1/2 times that of the widest point of the base.

Nose- The nose is prominent, extending beyond the lower jaw. It is of a rosy flesh color, never black or liver, and tends to harmonize with that of the coat. Pigment is solid or butterfly. Nostrils are open.

Body- The chest is deep and long with the breastbone sharply angled and prominent. The ribs are slightly sprung...

Gait- An efficient, light and graceful single tracking movement. A suspended trot with joint flexion when viewed from the side. The Ibizan exhibits smooth reach in front with balanced rear drive, giving the appearance of skimming over the ground.
