
# GUIDELINES FOR SUBMITTING CONTENT TO THE THIRD EYE

The intention of these guidelines is to make sure content is submitted legally, is appropriate for this publication, and meets the specifications required for print. Most of this shouldn't be new to members who have previously sent things in. These guidelines have been approved by the BOD.

Please contact us if you have any questions!

## -ADVERTISEMENTS-

- Completed full page ads should be 8.5" x 11.25" with full bleed.
- Photos submitted for a club-made ad should be as large as possible and 300dpi. Small images will not print well.
- Any photos that are not official win photos or taken by the dog's owner/ breeder must include the name of the photographer, along with a statement that the owner has permission to use the photograph(s).
- Ads for stud dogs or litters are strongly encouraged to include the parents' OFA numbers and if any health testing has been done. Please remember that the IHCUS COE requires breeding dogs be checked for hereditary defects.
- Any mention of ranking must include the most recently posted AKC/Chronicle/Dog News rankings and state the month and which system is being used. If a past year's ranking is being mentioned, the year and which system should still be included, and it should be the ranking from the end of that year.
- Ad placement is first come, first serve. Ads for premium placement - inside front cover, inside back cover, and back cover - must be paid for and received by that issue's deadline. No exceptions. Premium placement ads not received by the deadline will be downgraded to a regular ad and the premium page will be offered to whoever can immediately fill it. All other ads will be placed as needed, based on where color pages fit within that issue. We will try to meet your desires for near the front, etc. but we cannot guarantee placement beyond the premium pages.
- Accepted file types for completed ads or images are PDF, JPG, PNG, or Adobe Photoshop. Please feel free to ask if you need help with this.



## -ARTICLES-

- We welcome reprints! Please provide info on where the article is originally from (such as magazine name and issue number), along with correspondence obtaining permission for the Third Eye to print the article and how it should be credited.
- All health-related articles must include sources and/or citations for claims, **no exceptions**. These must be legitimate sources, such as research studies done by respected organizations or articles written by people with degrees from accredited schools in a related subject.
- All non-ad mentions of dogs' registered names, such as specialty results or Top 10, will be printed as provided by the show superintendent or the AKC, whichever is applicable. This also applies to the dog's owners and/or breeders.
- Please make sure the text of the article is print-ready. It should be proofed, have long links removed, etc. Word or Doc files are preferred, or the text placed in an e-mail, but PDF is also acceptable.
- Specialty and supported entry results will be printed as reported by the superintendent.
- **Anyone submitting an original article, minimum 2 pages, that is well-written and relevant to our breed will receive a 25% discount on an ad of their choice.**

## -BRAGS, ETC.-

- New Title brags can now choose to pay \$15 to "upgrade" their brag. This will include a black and white 1/4 page with the dog's photo, regularly included information (registered and call names, owner and breeder), and one extra line of text. What the extra line says is up to you! Mention where the title was earned, congratulate the breeder, tell readers that it's the 4th dog from the litter to earn a title, whatever you'd like.
- Receive a group placement recently? Have a small copy of the win photo included in an issue at no charge! Color or black and white is at the editor's digression, based on where space is available.

## -COVERS-

- All cover submissions must be of dogs no longer being shown in conformation (or who were never shown to begin with), with the exception of unidentifiable puppies.
- Photos must be large, of good quality, and generally fit the shape of the cover.
- Photos must be your own. Photos taken by others will only be accepted if the submitter is the owner of the dog and includes proof that permission has been obtained specifically for the cover – a screenshot of a facebook conversation, forwarding of an e-mail, etc. Proof of permission is also needed if the submitter is the photographer but not the owner of the dog.

A. Mitchell-Lynch said that the ribbons from Regal Rosettes, will have IHCUS's 25th anniversary on them, should we do the same thing with the Foy Trent Ribbons? Everyone agreed that we should go ahead and put it on all the rosettes. Order will be placed within the next week with Foy Trent. She needs to know how many rosettes for ASFA and AKC, or if we need ribbons for LGRA. She needs to know what to put on them. Rosettes company may change next year due to poor communication skills.

Parent Club Flyer program -- no draft has been received.


#### NEW BUSINESS

## Guidelines for Conducting IHCUS Business

**Forms of Communication:** Questions or concerns from IHCUS members should be submitted to the Secretary via E-mail at [secretary@ihcus.org](mailto:secretary@ihcus.org) or USPS. The Secretary is not responsible for communications addressed other than by these means. The Secretary will ensure the information reaches the proper IHCUS individuals for action. *There is no need to address anything to the Secretary and each Board member individually.*

**Complaints:** Must be in hard copy, signed, and mailed to the Secretary via the USPS. IHCUS is not responsible for addressing any e-mail communications that use a Board member's personal e-mail address. *Please use the IHCUS designated e-mail addresses such as [secretary@ihcus.org](mailto:secretary@ihcus.org) etc., which are listed in every newsletter and are on the IHCUS website.*

**Response Time Goals:** The Secretary will acknowledge receipt of communications no later than 7 working days from receipt date. The Board strives to provide a response *no later than 10 working days after the next scheduled IHCUS Board meeting.*

**IHCUS Awards Down & Dirty Guide**

1. All awards except for Hall of Fame require the dog is owned or co-owned by the applicant and the applicant must be an IHCUS member in good standing with the club and AKC.
2. The Sire/Dam must be registered with AKC.
3. Applications can be found on the IHCUS website. (Login and then go to Forms & Downloads to find the applications).
4. Send completed applications with all supporting documentation (copies of certifications and/or reports) to **awards@ihcus.org**
5. Certificates will be processed and awarded throughout the year and mailed to the applicant.
6. Plaques may be ordered for an additional charge through the IHCUS store. They will be awarded yearly at the IHCUS National Specialty.

**HOF (Hall of Fame):** Only award that does Not require IHCUS membership.

*Qualifications:*

1. Earn Best of Breed in conformation at the IHCUS National Specialty
2. 2 AKC NOHS Best in Show under 2 different judges
3. AKC Lure Coursing Best in Event at the AKC National Lure Coursing Trials
4. ASFA Best in Field at the International Invitational
5. ASFA winner of the Gillette Stake at the ASFA II

## THE FIRST EAST COAST "SPECIALTY"

**EARLY IN THE 1970'S**, my husband, Richard M. Hayford (Col. USAF retired), learned of an Airforce couple who had returned stateside from Europe with a pair of unusual hunting dogs from Ibiza. Ibiza is one of the Balearic Islands off the coast of Spain.

Around this time I saw a photograph in the "Ladies Home Journal" picturing Broadway star Larry Kert. He was walking in New York City, accompanied by his dog. The dog seemed to be keeping up very well. Kert said the dog, a rare breed called "Ibizan Hound", frequently walked on hind legs if he couldn't see where they were going. I kept the article and subsequently sent it to the IHCUS historian many years later.

In 1974, Richard, my mother and I answered an ad in the Sunday Washington Post for Ibizan Hound puppies. We three had a delightful visit with Joell and Dean Wright in Jarrettsville, Maryland. This involved meeting and greeting beautiful, exotic, energetic, amber-eyed, red and white coated affectionate puppies. It was hard to choose but we came back to Delaware with a strong, athletic male named "Mr. Bojangles". If you know the song of the same name, you may remember the line, "He would jump so high / Then he lightly touch down". The song is about Bill "Bojangles" Robinson, a famous dancer who appeared in Vaudeville in the 1930s and 1940s films dancing with Shirley Temple.

Bo and his half brother were the first of ten hounds - some Salukis - we lived with, loved, and enjoyed from 1974 until 2016.

I lost the best hunter of all: King Tuten Kahmen, age 15, and Gypsy Pearl, age 12. Working in tandem, Gypsy Pearl hazed the prey, with Tuttie doing the capture. They killed nine feral cats, three groundhogs, three opossums (one got loose in our bedroom for three days), and box turtles (she chewed off part of its shell, exposing pink). Gypsy was especially agile at bringing me "trophies," ie. live snakes (one as big as a baseball bat). Previous hunters cleared the yard of rabbits and squirrels, and treed a raccoon one night.

The majority of the photographs I have sent were taken April 28, 1979. By this time we had joined the brand new Ibizan Hound Club of America, now known as the Ibizan Hound Club of the United States. I met several club members through Dean Wright. Dean was President of the breed club.

“We” were told by the American Kennel Club that we needed more people with more hounds and each had a pedigree, and/or was listed in our stud book. Our breed was listed as a rare breed.

Finally, we achieved all the requirements for being accepted. We became part of the Hound Group.

On 28 April 1979, I had notified club members about the Wilmington (Delaware) Kennel Club all-breed dog show. It was held on the grounds of the Delaware Park race track (horses). This is a popular Mid-Atlantic dog show attracting exhibitors from all over the east coast. We invited the Beezer gang to come to our house for R & R before driving home. The cook of the family, my husband Richard, fixed lunch for everyone. Bojangles and I welcomed all of the beezers to the back yard.

# Exotic contender to join canines

Shades of Tutankhamun and the land of the Pharaohs - behold the Ibizan Hound.

And this you can do if you take yourself Saturday to the Wilmington Kennel Club show at Delaware Park (Stanton entrance).

Perhaps the most exotic of canine contenders will be the eight Ibizan hounds - at least one Delaware-owned - showing at Wilmington for the first time. The breed didn't receive American Kennel Club recognition for competition until January of this year - too late for the Westminster Show in Madison Square Garden in February.

But Ibizans have been competing for championship points in shows around the country this spring and now this rare but ancient dog of Egypt will be on view in little old Delaware.

Now who would expect to see another treasure of Tutankhamun at a dog show?

The breed, although as old as the hills and maybe older than the pyramids, is new to the purebred exhibitions in the United States. To make you feel more at ease with these aristocratic foreigners, their breed is pronounced eh-BEE-sn - so called because they flourished in the Balearic Islands, mainly Ibiza, off the coast of Spain in the Mediterranean. It is believed these dogs were taken to the islands by the Phoenicians as early as 900 B.C.

In Spain, where there are more of them than anywhere else in the world, the Ibizan is called the Podenco Ibicenco.

Ibiza, as you classical scholars must know, was the birthplace of Hannibal, who is said to have taken Ibizan hounds (as well as elephants) with him when he crossed the Alps into Italy.

But the Ibizan's link with history's "immortals" goes back at least three more centuries to the year 1300 B.C. The engraved image of Anubis, "Watchdog of the Dead," is among the Treasures of Tutankhamun, which has been going the rounds of world exhibit since 1972 when it opened at the British Museum in London. (I was there. I went, I saw and it is one of the few spectacles that rates well worth the five-hour wait outside the museum).

The Anubis coin, by the way, was one of the treasures found in the tomb of the Egyptian boy King Tut. It was at first thought the image was some kind of Jackal-god, but later comparison with the modern Ibizan led to the conclusion that these dogs existed in Egypt before,

during and after Tutankhamun's short lifetime.

These distinguished and distant associations give the Ibizan a mystique shared by such other African breeds as the Afghan, saluki, greyhound, and Pharaoh hound, which it closely resembles. Sight hounds all, they have the same elegance, grace, agility, speed and a certain aesthetic quality.

But ask the people who own them and you will learn that Ibizans are dogs, not spirits, and are wonderful and affectionate pets, as well as great trackers, hunters and obedience dogs.

Paula Tunstall of Newark, whose O'Bre-on's Peregrine of Pashtun will compete for breed honors Saturday, also has a spayed 9-year-old Ibizan named Issna Anum, strictly a pet.

"They're great dogs," she says, "very intelligent, and track by sound as well as sight."

Grace Hayford, also of Newark, whose 4-year-old Bo-Jangles is her second Ibizan, says he is a complete pet - not trained for show or showing any inclinations in that direction.

"There's not an aggressive bone in his body," she says. "He loves to play. He has a deep, resonant bark and is fascinated by children on bicycles and other dogs. He doesn't obey me at all but when he's at home all day with my husband (retired Col. Richard Hayford), he just follows him around and is blindly obedient."

Natural sprinters, Ibizans also are unexcelled in the high- and broad-jump, capable of leaping great heights from a standstill.

"That's how we lost our first one. We have a fenced yard but he jumped the fence and was killed on the highway," she says.

A facial feature peculiar to the Ibizan is an "ax mark" on the forehead, sometimes referred to as "the third eye." That is the name of the newsletter of the Ibizan Hound Club of the United States of which both Mrs. Tunstall and Mrs. Hayford are members.

The Ibizan has a short, flat, dense coat. It may be red, white, lion but usually is combinations of white and red or lion. The ears are erect, the muzzle long and narrow, tail long and sickle-shaped, nose pink to brown but never black, and the pink interiors of their ears tend to "blush" when they're excited, Mrs. Hayford says.



# Rare Ibizan dogs highlight

The treasures of Tutankhamen aren't the only ancient Egyptian marvels making the rounds of the U.S. this year.

Among the 1,800 entries in the Wilmington Kennel Club show at Delaware Park today will be eight rare Ibizan hounds, an ancient Egyptian breed that only this year reached the required registration figure to qualify for American Kennel Club competition.

Entries for the Wilmington show are up more than 100 over last year. The largest breed delegation, 96 bloodhounds, has been spurred by the American Bloodhound Club specialty.

Bloodhounds outnumber the poodle entries, 64 in the three varieties — standard, miniature and toy. Doberman pinschers have the second largest entry of 69, followed by 65 Great Danes, the 64 poodles and 59 Siberian huskies.

The specialty of the Interstate Shetland Sheepdog Club of Pennsylvania, Southern New Jersey and Delaware has drawn 46 Shelties into the running for this year's best-in-show.

Dr. Richard F. Greathouse of Jeffersontown, Ky., will pick the best of the six group finalists. Judging will start at 9 a.m. and continue until the grand winner is

selected, usually about 6 p.m.


