<u>Location.</u> Arizona State Fairgrounds, Veterans Memorial Coliseum, 1826 W McDowell Rd, Phoenix, AZ 85007 during the Heart of the Desert Classic Dog Show Cluster (Sahuaro State Kennel Club and Lost Dutchman Kennel Club); www.onofrio.com. The ADJE classroom is located in the northeast corner of the Coliseum floor. Enter through the front of the Coliseum and follow directional signs to the classroom.

<u>Parking.</u> There is ample parking at the Arizona State Fairgrounds accessed via Montevista Avenue off 19th Avenue. The daily fee is \$8.00 per car. Consult the Heart of the Desert Classic Cluster (Sahuaro State Kennel Club and Lost Dutchman Kennel Club) Premium at www.onofrio.com for details on a multi-day discount.

<u>Lodging.</u> The Cluster has extended an invitation for ADJE participants to lodge at the Cluster's host hotel and receive the Cluster's negotiated room rate (approximately \$149/night plus taxes). <u>You must contact ADJE by December 1, 2019, to have your name placed on the approved list before the hotel will accept your reservation.</u> The host hotel does not accept pets. For other lodging in the area, consult the Cluster Premium, www.onofrio.com.

The Cluster provides a shuttle from the host hotel and has also extended an invitation for participants who stay at the host hotel to ride the shuttle with judges. The shuttle leaves the hotel at 7:00 a.m. and returns about one-half hour after Best in Show. It is important that once you make a reservation to utilize the Shuttle that you follow through and ride the Shuttle. The Cluster pays for these buses and no-shows cost the Cluster just as though the person was there to ride.

<u>Food.</u> There are various food vendors at the Cluster site with food available for breakfast and lunch. There are no restrictions if you prefer to bring your own food. The area east of the Fairgrounds has multiple eateries but it is not within easy walking distance.

ADJE participants who are not exhibiting at the Cluster may dine in the Judges Hospitality Dining Room. The cost of that meal (which is the actual cost paid by ADJE) is \$21.00 and must be reserved in advance (emails will be sent out asking for reservations).
